About the Seminar:

Widening social and economic inequality within most countries and across the world is now well-documented and unarguable (UNDP, 2013). According to UN Report, 'inequality does not affect only the poor, but can be detrimental to growth, stability and well-being in general' (UN DESA, 2013). Social development is defined as a process of systematic change (Values, attitudes, institutions and practices) purposefully initiated through the instruments of social policy and planning for the enhancement of the levels of living and quality of life of the people especially the weaker sections in an ecofriendly, socially just and participatory environment. Social development is inclusive of economic development but it emphasizes the development of the society in totality that is, in its economic, political, social and cultural aspects (Gore, M.S; 1993). The Copenhagen Social Summit, 1995 defined Social Development in terms of 'Social harmony; Employment generation & Poverty eradication'. Amartya Sen says social development is equality of social opportunities.

India had made notable progress in achieving poverty reduction and some of the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) by initiating poverty alleviation and other developmental programmes, through various five year plans and also the Constitutional commitments, policies & legislations to protect the interests of the poor and marginalized sections. However, this progress has been uneven and millions of people still continue to remain trapped in extreme poverty.

The poverty rate is declined only 1.36 and still 29.5% people are under below poverty line (Planning commission, 2011-12). The Human Development Index value of India is 0.609 and could achieve 130th rank in World. (UNDP, 2015). India is positioned 55 in the ranking order of Global Hunger Index. Unemployment, gender inequality, social unrest, violation of human rights, issues related to health and education etc., are the major obstacles in hindering the development process and reduction of poverty.

Social work is a practice-based profession and an academic discipline that promotes social change and development, social cohesion, and the empowerment and liberation of people. In its first report on Global Agenda for

Social Work and Social development (2014), the focus has been given on promoting social and economic equalities; Promoting the dignity and worth of peoples; Working towards environmental and community sustainability and Strengthening recognition of the importance of human relationships.

Against this back ground, this National Seminar is intended to provide a platform to discuss the issues and challenges of social development in India.

Author (s) should follow American Psychological Association (APA) Format for References and other citations.
