**AU News, September:** The newly constructed Sri Mokshagundam Visweswaraiiah Hostel Complex at Andhra University was inaugurated by the Governor in collaboration which was constructed with the support of AU Engineering College Alumni. This modern hostel building spans over five floors and was built at a total



cost of Rs. 7.5 crores. The construction was carried out in phases, with the first three floors being completed at a cost of Rs. 3.75 crores. These three floors provide accommodation for 150 students across 48 rooms. The Engineering College Alumni Association took the initiative to construct and donate this building to Andhra University. Additionally, plans are in place to construct another two floors in the coming year. The complex is also set to benefit from the installation of the underground drainage system, beautification of the surroundings of the premises, and the construction of access roads. This facility will significantly enhance student accommodation and contribute to the overall infrastructure development of the university.

This hostel building has been constructed for international students. It is designed to be useful for international students. 44 rooms have been built in it. This new hostel has been constructed to accommodate the growing number of international students in the university.

**"Shatabdi Classic Hostel"**



## Ph.D in Hospitality Management





He mentioned that the center was inaugurated by the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Andhra Pradesh, Sri Y.S. 
